



I'm going to use mix media and I'm also going to play with textures (watercolor, pastels and pen). As I was working I changed the girls pose; originally she was going to be laying on top of the toilet but since I struggled to draw that I decided to change it and I think the pose she's in now really helps with my question.



For my second piece I am going to use pastels and maybe some type of paint. I have decided to change the composition of my piece; now it'll be from a different POV.





Materials (watercolor, pencil, sakura pigment pen, color pencils)

The material that is most significant with my price I would have to say is the watercolor. Watercolor is very messy and extremely hard to work with. My question is "how can my emotions affect my relations?" Emotions are messy. My piece is to make the statement of having "butterflies in your tummy" which is a feeling of worry or excitement. I'm this case the butterflies represent "worries". On September 2nd, I found out my sister had cancer. If you look on the wrist of the girl in my art, she is wearing an infinity bracelet, which is a bracelet my sister used to wear when she was younger. Exploring this, I have found ways to have more control over watercolor, creating new techniques that are best for me. Something I would change or do differently is that connection to my sister, focus more on the "relationship" part of my investigation.

Hernandez, Emily










I communicated this whole process with that I have seen of life, I combined things from my life and Things about soccer, everything in my work went well and I hope you like it Mrs. Stewart..




Project 2 10/25/21


