



Unit: Drawing

1. <u>proportion</u> is how parts of a work relate to each other and to the whole

2. grid technique a method for enlarging a small design to a full size cartoon for a large mosaic.

3. observational looking at the subject and drawing what is presented to the eye.

4. contour
drawing
the artist sketches the contour of a subject
by drawing lines that result in a drawing
that is essentially an outline

5. blending is the technique of varying the tonal values on the paper to represent the shade of the material as well as the placement of the shadows

Unit: Painting

1. painting

artwork created by applying paint to two-dimensional, three dimensional surface or using digital media.

2. nature study

a drawing used to help artists sharpen their perception of natural objects.

3. point of view

is the angle from which the viewer sees the scene in an artwork

4. composition

the way the principles of art are used to organize the elements of art -the proper arrangement of objects
